### Call for Bids

Dear young economist,

The workshop aims at promoting the exchange of ideas and experience among young economists conducting research in the same field of economics. The EAYE Workshop should focus on a clearly defined topic and bring together 20-40 young researchers from all European countries who work on this topic.

The aim of the EAYE is to facilitate the interaction between young non-tenured researchers in economics working on topics within economics. The planning document of maximum 2 pages should include at least the following issues:

- the names of at least 2 people under the age of 35 from your faculty who should still be at the institutions at the time of the workshop and who would be involved with the local organization;
- a clear workshop topic;
- a workshop concept with a spelled-out program with interactive formats;
- a sketch of the budget and
- a ranked list of keynote speakers that you plan to invite to the workshop.
